In other news, the US White House released a <u>new white paper</u> on 14 March 2023, *Methodologies and Considerations for Integrating the Physical and Transition Risks of Climate Change into Macroeconomic Forecasting for the President's Budget* by Council of Economic Advisers & Office of Management and Budget. In the paper, the G-Cubed Model, developed by the CAMA research team (Prof Warwick McKibbin, Dr Larry Weifeng Liu and Roshen Fernando) is referenced as 'integrates both emissions and energy data and is distinct from a number of other models in that it handles financial and physical capital separately (which differ greatly in terms of their mobility)'.

- ♦ The 10th Annual Workshop on Global Economy: Commodity Prices and Inflation organized and hosted by CAMA with funding from various research grants plus support from Rio Tinto was successfully concluded on 16 May 2023 (US time) in Washington DC. Prof Janine O'Flynn, Director of Crawford School of Public Policy, delivered the welcome speech for the workshop. Prof Warwick McKibbin, Prof Andrew Stoeckel and Prof Renee Fry-McKibbin chaired the panel sessions. This workshop brought together leading scholars to discuss the economic and geopolitical issues surrounding the recent surge in Inflation, its persistence and the role of commodity prices.
- ♦ Prof Warwick McKibbin presented 'The G-Cubed Model' in USA and Canada and 'Climate Risks and the Global Economy' in Norway, Ireland, France and NZ during May-June 2023.
