This year, the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Workshop on the Global Economy on 'Global Geoeconomic Fragmentation' will be held in joint with the Peterson Institute for International Economics (PIIE) on 24 April 2024. 

In the public lecture, Prof Jong-Wha Lee explores the multifaceted dynamics shaping Asia's economic and geopolitical landscape, offering a historical perspective on its remarkable growth and the key drivers of its global influence. Lee analyses the trajectories of major Asian economies and the USA over the next 50 years, assessing the profound impacts of demographic shifts and technological advancements. The lecture examines how Asia can

overcome critical challenges to sustain growth and enhance global influence amid rapidly changing economic environments worldwide.
